



3. Installation

3.1 Precautions


Before installation, read the following guidelines carefully:

 Before installation, ensure that the vehicle power supply has a negative ground with the voltage of 13.6±15% V. If you use 24 V power supply, convert the voltage through a voltage converter.

- Before installation, measure the length of screws protruding from the radio surface. During installation, drill the
 holes on the vehicle according to the screw length to avoid damaging the vehicle wires or other components.
- Use the antenna and power cord approved by the Company.
- Install the radio with the mounting bracket approved by the Company. Otherwise, the accidental drop of the radio
 may injure people in the vehicle.
- To facilitate wiring, keep sufficient space at the back of the radio.
- When replacing the fuse for the DC power cord, ensure that the new fuse has the same specification as the old one.
- If any other communication devices such as repeaters are in the vicinity of the radio, keep the antenna of these devices at least 10 meters away from that of the radio.
- Place the GPS antenna away from metal objects.


3.2 Procedure

- 1. Select a location for installation.
- 2. Mark the positions for drilling four holes using the bracket.
- 3. Drill the four holes according to the marks.
- 4. Use the tapping screws (5 mm x 12 mm) to secure the bracket.




5. Attach the antenna and power cord to the radio.

6. Mount the radio to the fixed bracket.



7. Install the microphone hanger in a reachable range, and then use the tapping screws (4 mm x 16 mm) to secure it.



- 8. Plug the aviation connector on the palm microphone into aviation port on the radio with the triangle index on the palm microphone upwards, and then rotate the connector clockwise to secure it.
- 9. Place the palm microphone on the hanger.

4. Basic Operations

4.1 Turning On or Off the Radio

Turning On the Radio

- After the vehicle is started, the radio automatically turns on.
- Long press the **On-Off** key for two seconds until the startup screen appears.

Turning Off the Radio

- After the vehicle shuts off, the radio automatically turns off.
- Long press the On-Off key for two seconds, press the Navigation key to select Power off, and then press the OK key.

4.2 Restarting the Radio

- Long press the On-Off key for two seconds, press the Navigation key to select Reboot, and then press the OK key.
- Long press the **On-Off** key for 15 seconds to forcibly restart the radio.

4.3 Adjusting the Volume

Rotate the Volume knob clockwise to increase the volume, or counter-clockwise to decrease the volume.

4.4 Understanding the Screen

4.4.2 Screen Operations

Turning Off the Screen

Short press the **On-Off** key.

Waking Up the Screen

Press any key.

4.5 Setting Programmable Keys

The radio provides **P1**, **P2**, **P3**, and **P4** as the programmable key. These keys can be programmed to perform specific task. At one press of the programmable key, you can get quick access to radio functions.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Settings**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Programmable key**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **P1**, **P2**, **P3**, or **P4**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 4. Press the **Navigation** key to select the feature, and then press the **OK** key.

4.6 Using the Dual SIM Cards

You can use two SIM cards, but cannot access data services simultaneously.

4.6.1 Enabling or Disabling the SIM Cards

- 1. Press the Navigation key to select Settings, and then press the OK key.
- 2. Press the Navigation key to select SIM cards, and then press the OK key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SIM slot 1** or **SIM slot 2**, and then press the **OK** key to enable or disable the SIM cards.

4.6.2 Setting the Preferred SIM Card

You can set a SIM card as the default card to access the Internet.

- 1. Press the Navigation key to select Settings, and then press the OK key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SIM cards**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the Navigation key to select Preferred SIM for, and then press the OK key to set the preferred SIM card.

4.7 Checking the Radio Information

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Settings**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **About phone**, and then press the **OK** key.

You can check the radio information such as status, model, and version.

5. PoC Services

You can use Push-to-Talk over Cellular (PoC) services such as one-to-one or one-to-many voice call over the public network.



This service is available only when you have installed the PoC application on the radio.

After the radio is connected to a WLAN or cellular network, you can initiate a call through the PoC application.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select the PoC application, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Select a contact.
- 3. On the palm microphone, press and hold the **PTT** key, and then speak.
- 4. Release the **PTT** key.

You can receive a call without any operation.

6. System Settings

Press the **Navigation** key to select **Settings**, press the **OK** key, and then set the following radio parameters.

6.1 WLAN

After the radio connects to WLAN, you can access the Internet.

- 1. Press the **OK** key twice to enable the WLAN.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select an available WLAN in the list, and then press the **OK** key.
- (Optional) If a password is required, enter the password, press the Navigation key to select Done, and then press the OK key.

The radio saves WLAN information after successful connection.

6.2 BT

The BT feature allows you to transmit voice through wireless earpiece or remote speaker microphone.

6.2.1 Pairing with a BT Accessory

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **BT**, and then press the **OK** key twice to enable the BT.
- 2. Press the Navigation key to select the device from the Available devices list.
- 3. Press the **OK** key.

The **Pair with xxx**? dialog box appears. xxx indicates the BT device name.

4. Press the **OK** key again to pair with the device.

6.2.2 Unpairing a BT Accessory

Enable the BT.

For details, see step 1 in 6.2.1 Pairing with a BT.

Press the Navigation key to select the device from the Paired devices list, and then press the OK key twice to disconnect from the device.

6.2.3 Modifying a BT Accessory Name

You can rename the BT accessory for easier identification.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Device name**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Enter the device name.

3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Done**, and then press the **OK** key.

6.3 Cellular Network

Before connecting to the cellular network, make sure that the Nano SIM card is installed and the cellular data service is activated.

Press the **Navigation** key to select **Cellular networks**, and then press the **OK** key. You can perform the following operations.

6.3.1 Enabling the Cellular Data

Press the **OK** key again.

6.3.2 Checking the Data Usage

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Mobile network settings**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SIM slot 1** or **SIM slot 2**.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Data usage**, and then press the **OK** key.

You can keep track of your data usage and avoid exceeding the limit.

6.3.3 Selecting the Network Type

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Mobile network settings**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SIM slot 1** or **SIM slot 2**.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Preferred network type**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 4. Press the **Navigation** key to select the network, and then press the **OK** key.

6.3.4 Enabling the Data Roaming

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Mobile network settings**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SIM slot 1** or **SIM slot 2**.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Data roaming**, and then press the **OK** key.

You can still use cellular data even when you are outside of your network.

6.4 Airplane Mode

In Airplane mode, your radio automatically disconnects from the cellular network and WLAN. In this case, you cannot use data services.

To enable or disable Airplane mode, press the Navigation key to select More, and then press the OK key twice.

6.5 Hotspot

After the radio connects to the cellular or WLAN network, you can share your internet connection with other devices.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **More**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the Navigation key to select Tethering & portable hotspot, and then press the OK key.
- 3. Press the **OK** key to enable **Portable WLAN hotspot**.
- 4. Specify **Network name**, **Security**, and **Password**.

6.6 Display

6.6.1 Adjusting the Brightness

You can adjust the brightness to make the screen brighter or dimmer in different situations.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Display**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **OK** key again to select **Brightness level**.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key left or right.

6.6.2 Setting the Sleep Time

You can set the sleep time to allow the radio to automatically turn off its screen if no operation is made within the preset sleep time. It helps save battery power.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Display**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Sleep**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select the sleep time, and then press the **OK** key.

6.6.3 Adjusting the Font Size

You can adjust the font size according to your reading habit.

- 1. Press the Navigation key to select Display, and then press the OK key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Font size**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key left or right.

6.7 Sound

6.7.1 Setting the Profile

You can set the profile of the radio according to different scenarios.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Sound**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **OK** key again.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Silent** or **Ringtone**, and then press the **OK** key.

6.7.2 Selecting the Speaker

You can use the internal or external speaker according to different scenarios.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Sound**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Speaker**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Internal** or **External**, and then press the **OK** key.



If you use an external speaker, ensure that the radio is connected to it.

6.7.3 Enabling the Emergency Broadcast

In case of emergencies, the emergency broadcast allows you to receive the relevant information through the radio.

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Sound**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Emergency broadcasts**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - > Press the **Navigation** key to select a broadcast type, and then press the **OK** key.

The options include Show extreme threats, Show severe threats, and Show AMBER alerts.

- > Press the **Navigation** key to select **Turn on notifications**, and then press the **OK** key to enable or disable it.
- Press the Navigation key to select Alarm reminder, press the OK key, press the Navigation key to select the frequency of alarm reminder, and then press the OK key again.

6.8 Storage

6.8.1 Checking the Storage Usage

1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Storage**, and then press the **OK** key.

2. Press the **OK** key to view the internal storage.

6.8.2 Freeing up the Storage Space

View the internal storage.

For details, see 6.8.1 Checking the Storage Usage.

2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Cached data**, and then press the **OK** key.

The Clear cached data? dialog box appears.

3. Press the **OK** key.

6.9 Memory

Press the Navigation key to select Memory, and then press the OK key.

You can view the occupied memory of running applications.

6.10 Location

The Location feature allows the radio to obtain its location information through WLAN, cellular network, or GPS.

The location-related application such as Hytera HyTalk can access the location data of the radio.

6.10.1 Setting the Location Mode

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Location**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **OK** key to enable **Location**.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Mode**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 4. Select one of the following location modes:
 - > **High accuracy**: The radio uses the combination of GPS, WLAN, and cellular network to determine precise location.
 - > **Battery saving**: The radio uses WLAN and cellular network for location, so as to save battery power.
 - **Device only**: The radio uses only GPS for location, without using cellular data.
- 5. Press the **OK** key.

6.10.2 Improving Location Accuracy

1. Enable **Location**.

For details, see steps 1–2 6.10.1 Setting the Location Mode.

- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Scanning**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Turn **WLAN scanning** or **BT scanning** on or off.
 - > WLAN scanning: Allow the system applications and service to scan for WLAN network to get better location information.
 - > **BT scanning**: Allow system applications and service to scan the nearby BT device and connect to it to get better location information.

6.11 Language

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Languages**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select the display language, and then press the **OK** key.

6.12 Factory Data Reset



CAUTION

If the Factory Data Reset feature is activated, all data from the radio such as personal account information and downloaded applications will be permanently erased.

When the radio runs slowly or the applications quit unexpectedly, you can reset the radio to the factory settings to fix the problem.

Press the Navigation key to select Factory data reset, and then press the OK key three times.

6.13 Safe Mode

Some keys on the radio are locked during driving to protect the driver's focus on the road. In case of over speeding or fatigue driving, the radio gives an alarm to ensure a safe trip.

Press the **Navigation** key to select **Safe mode**, press the **OK** key, and then select whether to enable the following features:

- Disable operation while driving: After enabling this feature, you need to set the trigger speed. When the driving speed exceeds the preset trigger speed and lasts for more than one minute, you can use only the Emergency key,
 Volume knob, On-Off key, Answer key, End key, and programmable keys.
- Driver fatigue alert: After enabling this feature, you need to set the break time. When you drive continuously for
 over four hours, you need to have a rest. When the time interval between parking and driving is less than the
 break time, the radio will initiate an alarm.

High speed alert: After enabling this feature, you need to set the speed limit. When the average driving speed in one minute exceeds the speed limit, the radio will initiate an alarm.

6.14 Date and Time

The radio can automatically synchronize with the local date, time, and time zone over a cellular network or allows you to manually set them.

6.14.1 Setting the Date, Time, and Time Zone

- Press the Navigation key to select Date & time, and then press the OK key.
- 2. Press the Navigation key to select Automatic date & time or Automatic time zone, and then do one of the following:

Method	Operation
Enable the radio to update the date, time, and time zone automatically	Press the OK key to enable the option.
Set the date, time, and time zone manually	 3. Press the OK key to disable the option. 4. Press the Navigation key to select Set date, Set time, or Select time zone, and then press the OK key. 5. Specify the date, time, or time zone.

6.14.2 Setting the Time Format

You can set the time format to 12-hour or 24-hour.

- Press the **Navigation** key to select **Date & time**, and then press the **OK** key.
- Press the Navigation key to select Use 24-hour format, and then press the OK key to enable the feature.

The radio uses the 24-hour format. Otherwise, the radio uses the 12-hour format.

6.15 Upgrade



CAUTION

- Do not upgrade the radio system with unauthorized software to avoid radio failure, data loss, or potential security problems.
- Be sure to back up your data before upgrade.

- Ensure that the memory space is sufficient before upgrade.
- Before upgrade, ensure that the radio is connected to the WLAN or cellular network. To save data traffic, it is recommended to download the upgrade package through WLAN.
- During upgrade, the radio cannot provide any service. After the upgrade is complete, the radio will automatically restart.

When a new firmware version is available, you can upgrade the system in one of the following ways:

Automatic upgrade

The Smart MDM server automatically upgrades the system.

- Manual upgrade
 - > You will receive the upgrade notification from the Smart MDM server.
 - > Press the **Navigation** key to select **System upgrade**, press the **OK** key, and then follow the on-screen instructions to download and install the upgrade package.

7. Applications

7.1 Installing an Application

7.1.1 Through the APP Center

- 1. Connect the radio to the cellular or WLAN network.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **APPCenter**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select the application, and then press the **OK** key.
- 4. Upon downloading completion, press the **OK** key.

7.1.2 Through the Android Debug Bridge

- 1. Install the Android Debug Bridge on the PC.
- 2. Connect the radio to the PC with the data cable.
- 3. On the PC, press the Win + R key combination to open the Run dialog box.
- 4. Enter "cmd", and then press **Enter** to open the command prompt window.
- 5. Run the adb install -r D:\xxx.apk command.

"D:\xxx.apk" indicates the path of the installation package.

7.2 Uninstalling an Application

If you no longer use an application, you can uninstall it to release storage and improve radio performance.

- 1. Press the Navigation key to select Settings, and then press the OK key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Apps**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **Navigation** key to select the application, and then press the **OK** key.
- 4. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Uninstall**, and then press the **OK** key.

7.3 Forcibly Stopping an Application

If an application does not respond for a long while, you can forcibly stop this application.

- 1. Enter the application settings interface.
 - For details, see steps 1–3 in 7.2 Uninstalling an Application.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Force stop**, and then press the **OK** key.

7.4 Clearing the Data or Cache

You can clear the configuration information or temporarily cached data when there is insufficient storage or the application runs slowly.

1. Enter the application settings interface.

For details, see steps 1–3 in 7.2 Uninstalling an Application.

- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Storage**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Do either of the following:
 - To clear the data, press the **OK** key twice.
 - > To clear the cache, press the **Navigation** key to select **Clear cache**, and then press the **OK** key.

7.5 Setting the Application Permissions

You can grant permission to the application for accessing certain functions of the radio, so as to protect your data and privacy.

1. Enter the application settings interface.

For details, see steps 1–3 in 7.2 Uninstalling an Application.

- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Permissions**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **OK** key to enable or disable the permissions.

8. Sound Recorder

The SoundRecorder application allows you to record voice at any time during your work time or daily life.

8.1 Recording an Audio File

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SoundRecorder**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **OK** key to start recording.
- 3. Press the **OK** key again to finish recording.

8.2 Managing an Audio File

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **SoundRecorder**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to enter the **File** tab, and then press the **Navigation** key to select the audio file.
- 3. Press the **OK** key, and then do one of the following:
 - > Press the **OK** key again to play the audio.
 - Press the Navigation key to select Share via BT, and then press the OK key to share the audio file through the BT if a BT device is connected.
 - > Press the **Navigation** key to select **View details**, and then press the **OK** key to view the audio details, such as recording time, duration, file size, and storage path.
 - > Press the **Navigation** key to select **Delete**, and then press the **OK** key twice to delete the audio file.

9. Camera

After the radio is connected to the external camera, the Camera application allows you to shoot photos and videos.

9.1 Taking a Photo

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Other Apps**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **Navigation** key to select **Camera**, and then press the **OK** key.
- 3. Press the **OK** key to take the photo.

9.2 Recording a Video

1. Enter the camera.

For details, see steps 1–2 in 9.1 Taking a Photo.

- 2. Press the Navigation key to select , and then press the OK key to start recording video.
- 3. Press the **OK** key again to finish recording.

9.3 Viewing a Photo or Video

1. Enter the camera.

For details, see steps 1–2 in 9.1 Taking a Photo.

2. Press the **Navigation** key to select , and then press the **OK** key to view photos or videos.

10. Gallery

The Gallery application allows you to manage photos and videos.

Press the **Navigation** key to select **Other Apps**, and then press the **OK** key twice to enter the gallery. You can perform the following operations.

10.1 Photos

10.1.1 Viewing a Photo

- 1. Press the **Navigation** key to select the photo, and then press the **OK** key.
- 2. Press the **OK** key again to view the photo.

12. Care and Cleaning

- Clean up the dust and fine particles on the radio surface with a clean and dry lint-free cloth or a brush regularly.
- Use neutral cleanser and a non-woven fabric to clean the keys, knobs, and front case after long-time use. Do not use chemical preparations such as stain removers, alcohol, sprays, or oil preparations, so as to avoid surface case damage.
- Make sure that the radio is completely dry before use.
